Director's note

YOU GET ME

I'm so pleased to welcome you to *Carbon*. The Cherry's 2023 was a year of exciting explorations of movement-based theater (clown with *Heading into Night*, dance with *e-motion*, aerial with *Air Heart*, and circus with *Peter and the Wolf*). But our first love has always been to produce extraordinary new plays from around the world, in English for the first time. We love the ways that international writing expands our ideas of what theater writing can look like. And it's been a long time since we encountered a voice as extraordinary as Pier Lorenzo Pisano's.

When we produce writing, like Lorenzo's, that's quite different from most US theater writing, I've noticed a common, slightly anxious response from a lot of our audience members: "I enjoyed it, but I'm not sure I got it." And I get it! (If you're a person who has never thought that about one of our plays, no need to read on. You know what to do.)

Here's my advice to folks who are concerned about not "getting it". Don't try! Think of an abstract painting or sculpture. As a culture, we're accustomed to them enough that we don't ask, "but what is it a painting of?" We let ourselves be moved by these works in less specific ways. If there are aspects of this play that you're not sure you "get," just don't sweat it. Like an abstract painting, plays like this are aiming to inspire and stimulate you—not test you! The difference I see in audience members isn't between the folks who "get it" and the folks who don't—it's between the folks who are worried they didn't get it, and the folks who knew not to try.

Now that I've thoroughly freaked you out, don't worry! This play is no weirder than many others many of you have seen and enjoyed in this room. *Carbon* isn't afraid to tackle the big questions, and I'm not sure a play can go this big without breaking out of traditional forms. Release yourself to it! We're thrilled to have you here for the ride.

MARC GOMES



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
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


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
